



Frequently Asked Questions & Boarding Student Packing List

Kitchens

Every dorm has a kitchen that students have access to use in the evenings and weekends to prepare their own meals. Each kitchen is equipped with a stove, microwave, toaster, electric kettle and refrigerator(s). Students are permitted to bring additional appliances like a keurig and rice cooker, but they are responsible for storage of those items. Pots and pans are **not** provided by the school, so they are required to bring their own if cooking is of interest to them. Mini refrigerators are also a privilege limited to our Proctors (boarding student leaders), so please refrain from bringing.

Dorm Room Decor & Potential Damages

We allow our students to decorate their dorm rooms according to their desire and interest. We do discourage students from using nails, push pins or other items that will cause damage. Students will be responsible for any damages to walls, ceilings, doors, floors, bathrooms or furniture.

Items that are **NOT** permitted in the dorms are:

- Adhesive LED lights, nails and push pins
- Lighters, matches, candles & incense
- Televisions, large computer monitors, gaming systems (PS5, Nintendo Switch, etc)
- Knives and swords
- Tattooing equipment, stick & poke and ink
- Prescribed medications (Must be secured in the Nurse's Office)
